Goal of the seminar:

LGBT (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Trasgender) Rights have been widely claimed and asserted by civil society organisations. LGBT Rights have also been progressively recognised by national and international bodies. However, in most places around the world as well as in many European countries, these rights have not been formally recognised yet. Furthermore, even where they have been legally enshrined, their effective fulfilment remains far from being realised.

The goal of this seminar is to foster reflection and dialogue about the human rights to gender identity and sexual orientation, both from a legal perspective and from a public policy perspective. In particular, the seminar will bring an opportunity to think about the role that Ombudspersons can play in the defence and promotion of these rights.

The seminar will be divided in five sessions combining legal context, advocacy by civil society, public policy analysis, and two workshops to share best practices.
